The Issuer is engaged in the business of mineral exploration and the acquisition of mineral property assets in Canada. Its objective is to locate and develop economic precious and base metal properties of merit. The Issuer is also seeking new mineral exploration properties.

During the Month, management's principal activities consisted of activities which included, but were not limited to, discussion on and the preparation of necessary documentation in respect of:

Old Fort Property

During February 2023, the Issuer acquired by staking a 100% interest in two contiguous mineral claims covering 3,314 hectares (the "Old Fort Property" or the "Property") located in the Babine District of northern British Columbia, approximately 22 km north of the village of Granisle, BC.

During the summer of 2023, the Issuer engaged a geologist to visit the Property and carry out field exploration. Rock samples were shipped to an assayer for analysis. The geologist received assay results on 15 the rock samples collected from the Property. During the month of December 2023, the Issuer received the geologist's written report on the work performed and the assays. Based on this report and other information the Issuer will develop its 2024 exploration plans for the Property.

The decision to perform exploration work is affected by the commodities market with respect to the commodities prices of gold and copper, as well as the capital markets and the Issuer's ability to raise funds to perform further exploration of the Old Fort Property.

The Issuer has no history of earnings and to date has not defined any commercial quantities of mineral reserves. The Issuer and its assets may become subject to uninsurable risks. The Issuer may be affected by political, economic, environmental and regulatory risks beyond its control. The Issuer is currently largely dependent on the performance of its directors and officers and there is no assurance the Issuer can retain their services. In recent years both metal prices and publicly traded securities prices have fluctuated widely.
