The Issuer is focused on investing in emerging growth companies. The Issuer's investment objectives are to seek investment opportunities in early-stage to mid-level emerging growth companies and to achieve an acceptable rate of return by focusing on opportunities with specific business plans and senior management teams. Investments by the Issuer will be made in accordance with, and are otherwise subject to, the Issuer's investment policy, which may be amended from time to time.

The primary business of the Issuer's wholly-owned subsidiary CBIO Brand Development Inc. ("CBIO"), is the commercialization of complex consumer goods. Through its primary brand, www.armourgenix.com, CBIO management has been navigating the global pandemic looking for additional opportunities to growth their business. CBIO management will be pursuing financing opportunities in the new year and will advise and work with the Issuer's management as they do so.

In March 2021, the Company created CNV Mining Holdings Corp. as a wholly owned subsidiary for its resource investments allowing these investments to develop through a series of subsidiaries with a focus on mining and mineral exploration. The corporate structure will allow the Company to divest certain interests in its subsidiary companies in order to maximize the value potential for Brand X, and its shareholders, from an investment perspective.

The Company entered into a joint venture option agreement with arm's-length vendors to acquire a 100-per-cent interest in the Urban Barry gold project. The Urban Barry gold project covers an area of 1,126 hectares in the Urban Barry gold greenstone belt, central Quebec and lies completely within claims held by Osisko Mining Inc., the largest landholder in the camp.

Under the terms of the agreement, the Company can acquire a 100-per-cent interest in the project by issuing an aggregate of nine million common shares, paying \$1.3-million over three years and completing \$2.1-million in exploration. No new insiders will be created as a result of this transaction. In addition, a 1-per-cent gross overriding royalty has been granted to the vendors, of which 0.5 per cent can be purchased from the vendors for \$1-million.

The northern extent of the project hosts a portion of the Urban Barry deformation zone as well as portions of the two major faults in the gold camp, both of which have produced significant gold deposits.
