Developments

In November, Perk announced that it has engaged CHF Capital Markets ("CHF"), a highly-regarded Canadian investor relations and capital markets firm to handle Perk's corporate communications, shareholder relations, investment industry outreach, and social and digital marketing.

The Company's CEO issued a letter to shareholders, reviewing the prior year and providing an outlook for the next year, taking into account both internal developments and external conditions. He noted how the COVID-19 pandemic has disrupted the daily lives of people everywhere and has also provided new opportunities for Perk, given the accelerated shift from in-store to online and digital purchasing. The letter discussed how the Company has re-evaluated and shifted our efforts and priorities.

The Company also reported an increase in the dollar volume of purchases transacted through its app in the month of November, highlighted by a notable spike in the number of gift card purchases from customers in multiple locations across Canada, as well as a surge in signing up new eCommerce merchants to its app.

Perk also provided an update on its At-The-Market Program. Since commencing the program, as of November 30th the Company has raised gross proceeds of \$429,091 of which \$266,766 was raised in the month of November. The financing proceeds strengthen the Company's balance sheet and will allow Perk to expand its sales and marketing efforts.

The COVID-19 pandemic is having an effect on how people pay for goods and services. We have seen a drop off in in-store and in-dining payments, and we are also seeing the need and demand for mobile ordering and safe contact-free digital payments. We are helping businesses to adopt contactless payments such as payment by quick response codes or payment by taking a photo of a bill as a better way to serve their customers and provide a safe environment for their employees. We continue to monitor the evolving situation in these uncertain times and to adapt our business accordingly.
