On October 29, 2021 a Letter of Intent (the “LOI”) was entered into between the Issuer and 2747524 Ontario Inc. o/a Cylix Data (the “Vendor”) contemplating an acquisition of substantially all of the assets of the Vendor for consideration of \$32,350,000.00 (the “Purchase Price”). The primary asset to be acquired is a proprietary database. The Purchase Price will be satisfied in the issuance of 64,700,000 units (the “Units”) in the capital of the Issuer with the price being equal to \$0.50 per Unit with each Unit comprised of one common share of the Issuer (“Common Share”) and one-seventh of one Common Share purchase warrant (each whole warrant, a “Warrant”). Each Warrant entitles the holder to acquire one additional Common Share of the Issuer at a price of \$0.60 for a period of 24 months.

The Vendor’s assets are complementary to the Issuer’s assets and are intended to be integrated with the Issuers existing assets and operated in tandem. Specifically, the Vendor’s cloud-based SaaS database will become the technology to connect the data and information that drives the Issuer’s SaaS platform and its cloud-based peer-to-peer payment platform. Once integrated with the Issuer’s SaaS platform and its cloud-based peer-to-peer payment platform, the Vendor’s technology can provide comprehensive customer information for businesses prior to allocating resources (such as mitigating fraud risk in contracting services and in payment transactions). This alone adds a valuable selling feature and cross-pollinating income source as an “add on” node for the business of the Issuer. Both of the Issuer’s SaaS platform and its cloud-based peer-to-peer payment platform will organically exchange data with the Vendor’s database populating new data points which will result in a more robust and valuable offering for the Issuer.

Pursuant to the LOI, the Issuer will acquire substantially all of the assets of the Vendor for consideration of \$32,350,000.00 payable by issuance of 64,700,000 Units of the Issuer. The primary asset to be acquired is a proprietary database.

The acquisition will be completed by way of an asset purchase agreement between the Issuer and the Vendor and the Purchase Price will be satisfied in Units with a deemed price of \$0.50 per Unit.
