Report on Business

The Issuer is a mineral exploration and resource development company focused on identifying economically viable resource opportunities in the Americas. Its objective is to locate and develop economic precious and base metal properties of merit, and to conduct its exploration program on the Adam West Property (the "Adam West Property"). The Adam West Property consists of five (5) mineral claims covering an area of 3,097.60 hectares, located approximately 15 kilometres southwest of the town of Sayward on Vancouver Island, British Columbia, Canada, in the Nanaimo Mining Division.

2. Provide a general overview and discussion of the activities of management.

During April 2020, management's principal activities consisted of activities which included, but were not limited to, discussion on and the preparation of necessary documentation,

- (i) **in respect of a non-brokered private placement of up to 3,500,000 units (the "Units") at a price of \$0.10 per Unit for gross proceeds of up to \$350,000. Each Unit will consist of one common share in the capital of the Issuer and two separate one-half (1/2) of one common share purchase warrants (see news release dated May 6, 2020);**
 - (ii) **in respect of entering into an assignment and assumption agreement dated April 17, 2020 (the "Agreement") with 1243461 B.C. Ltd. ("3461"), a private British Columbia corporation, whereby 3461 has assigned to the Issuer (the "Assignment") all of its rights under two letters of intent (the "Letters of Intent") with third party vendors to acquire a 100% interest in and to (i) certain exploitation mining concessions comprising approximately 1,000 hectares located in the Diego de Almagro Province of the Atacama Region, Chile (the "Rio Loa Project"), and (ii) certain exploitation mining concessions comprising approximately 1,600 hectares located in the Diego de Almagro and Copiapo Provinces of the Atacama Region, Chile (collectively, the "Coya Project"; together with the Rio Loa Project, the "Projects") (see news release dated May 6, 2020); and**
 - (iii) **in respect of general management and administrative matters.**

The Issuer has no history of earnings and to date has not defined any commercial quantities of mineral reserves on the Adam West Property. The Issuer has an option only to acquire an interest in the Adam West Property and there is no guarantee that the Issuer's 100% interest, if earned, will be certain or that it cannot be challenged by claims of aboriginal or indigenous title, or unknown third parties claiming an interest in the Adam West Property. The Issuer may not be able to enter into definitive agreements in respect of the Assignment, and the rights contemplated by the Letters of Intent involve an option only to earn a 100% interest in the Projects, and there is no guarantee that a 100% interest, if earned, will be certain or that it cannot be challenged by claims of aboriginal or indigenous title, or unknown third parties claiming an interest in the Projects. The Issuer and its assets may also become subject to uninsurable risks. The Issuer's activities may require permits or licenses which may not be granted to the Issuer. The Issuer competes with other companies with greater financial resources and technical facilities. The Issuer may be affected by political, economic, environmental and regulatory risks beyond its control. The Issuer is currently largely dependent on the performance of its directors and officers and there is no assurance the Issuer can retain their services. In recent years both metal prices and publicly traded securities prices have fluctuated widely.

The outbreak of the coronavirus ("COVID-19") pandemic is likely to impact the Issuer's plans and activities. The Issuer may face disruption to operations, supply chain delays, travel and trade restrictions and impact on economic activity in affected countries or regions can be expected and can be difficult to quantify. Such pandemics or diseases represent a serious threat to maintaining a skilled workforce industry and could be a major health-care challenge for the Issuer. There can be no assurance that the Issuer's personnel will not be impacted by these pandemic diseases and ultimately that the Issuer would see its workforce productivity reduced or incur increased medical costs/insurance premiums as a result of these health risks. In addition, the COVID-19 pandemic has created a dramatic slowdown in the global economy. The duration of the COVID-19 outbreak and the resultant travel restrictions, social distancing, government response actions, business closures and business disruptions, can all have an impact on the Issuer's operations and access to capital. There can be no assurance that the Issuer will not be impacted by adverse consequences that may be brought about by the COVID-19 pandemic on global financial markets which may result in reduced resource prices, share prices and financial liquidity and thereby may severely limit the financing capital available.
