RESULTS OF OPERATIONS

The net asset value of the Fund decreased by \$0.1 million to \$26.6 million from December 31, 2017 to June 30, 2018. The portfolio's performance decreased assets by \$0.1 million. The Fund returned -0.2% after fees and expenses for the six-month period ended June 30, 2018. Over the same time period, the Fund's benchmark returned 0.1%. The benchmark is the ICE Bank of America Merrill Lynch U.S. High Yield Total Return Index.

As previously announced, the Fund has continued to hold private positions (the "Private Portfolio"). Marret's intention is to distribute the net proceeds from the Private Portfolio when the holdings are sold and the proceeds are received by the Fund. No ongoing management fee or other fees will be charged by Marret for overseeing the liquidation of the Private Portfolio.

The value of the Private Portfolio consists of equity and bonds issued by Cline Mining Inc. ("Cline"). Cline holds various mineral assets, including the New Elk Coal Mine in Colorado, which has almost 630 million tonnes of in-place coal.

RECENT DEVELOPMENTS

Cline Minina

The first half of 2018 saw some volatility in the price of metallurgical coal. After starting the year at ~\$260//tonne, prices ranged between \$180 and \$200 in April to June 2018. Prices have remained relatively high due to increased Chinese demand, supply disruptions in Australia, producer supply discipline and environmental group pressure limiting supply.

Cline continues to be engaged with multiple parties in exploring fresh capital and perhaps new ownership for Cline. The visions for Cline are extremely varied, as are these parties' perception of value. These negotiations are complicated and have proven to be protracted in the past. Overall, the prospects for a liquidity event have improved, yet are far from certain. Cline will face more challenging liquidity issues if a transaction is not completed in the near term.

RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

Independent Review Committee

The Fund received standing instructions from the Independent Review Committee ("IRC") with respect to the following Related Party Transactions: trades in securities of CI Financial Corp. and Marret Resource Corp.

The Applicable standing instructions require that Related Party Transactions be conducted in accordance with the Manager's policies and procedures. The Manager is required to advise the IRC of any material breach of a condition of the standing instructions. The standing instructions require, among other things, that the investment decisions in respect to Related Party Transactions (a) are made by the Manager free from any influence by any entities related to the Manager and without taking into account any consideration to any affiliate of the Manager; (b) represent the business judgment of the Manager uninfluenced by considerations other than the best interests of the Fund; and (c) are made in compliance with the Manager's policies and procedures. Transactions made by the Manager under the standing instructions are subsequently reviewed by the IRC on a quarterly basis to monitor compliance.

The Fund relied on the IRC's standing instructions regarding Related Party Transactions during this reporting period.

⁽³⁾ Distributions to unitholders are based on the number of units outstanding on the record date for each distribution and were paid in cash.

⁽⁴⁾ Management expense ratio is based on total expenses (excluding commissions and other portfolio transaction costs) of the Fund for June 30, 2018, December 31, 2017, 2016 and 2015 and of the Fund and Marret HYS Trust for the prior periods, including interest expense and issuance costs, and is expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average Net Asset Value of the period.

⁽⁵⁾ The Fund's portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the Fund's portfolio manager manages its portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the period. The higher the Fund's portfolio turnover rate in a period, the greater the trading costs payable by the Fund in the period. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of the Fund. Portfolio turnover rate is calculated by dividing the lesser of the cost of purchases and the proceeds of sales of portfolio securities for the period, excluding cash and short-term investments maturing in less than one year, by the average market value of investments during the period.

⁽⁶⁾ The trading expense ratio represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net asset value of the Fund during the period.


