Report on Business

The Issuer is positioning itself to be one of the top three multi-state cannabis operators active in the U.S. legal cannabis and hemp sector. The Issuer is predominately focusing its investments on major markets in the United States, including Michigan, Illinois, Massachusetts, California, and Florida in respect to cannabis and the US and internationally for hemp-based CBD products.

See Item 2 below for a summary of the Issuer's business and operations during the month of August 2021.

During the month of August 2021, management's primary activities consisted of:

- Announcing that the Issuer's subsidiary, Red White & Bloom Florida LLC ("RWBFL") closed the acquisition of an operational 45,000 square foot greenhouse situated on 4.7 acres of land in Apopka, Florida;
- The preparation and filing of the Issuers interim financial statements and MD&A for the six month period ended June 30, 2021; and
- general management and administrative matters.

3. Describe and provide details of any new products or services developed or offered. For resource companies, provide details of new drilling, exploration or production programs and acquisitions of any new properties and attach any mineral or oil and gas or other reports required under Ontario securities law.

The Issuer announced that its wholly owned subsidiary RWBFL closed on the acquisition of an operational 45,000 square foot greenhouse situated on 4.7 acres of land in Apopka, Florida. The Issuer will begin rapid development on the facility to ensure all compliance standards are achieved for a Q4 2021 harvest schedule. This acquisition comes directly on the heels of the Sanderson Florida purchase and provides immediate benefits for significant cultivation expansion for delivery to RWBFL stores in Florida. The Issuer and RWBFL completed a Real Estate Purchase and Sale Agreement for a purchase price of US \$1,875,000 payable as: (a) US \$750,000 cash paid on closing; (b) US \$125,000 in the form of promissory note of RWBFL payable in 5 monthly instalments commencing 30 days after Closing; and (c) US \$1,000,000 worth of RWB Common Shares at a price of \$1.22, being 1,010,656 shares (issued July 30, 2021).

COVID-19

The outbreak of the corona virus pandemic has impacted the Issuer's plans and activities. The Issuer may face disruption to operations, travel and trade restrictions and impact on economic activity in affected countries or regions can be expected and can be difficult to quantify. Such pandemics or diseases represent a serious threat to maintaining a skilled workforce industry and could be a major health-care challenge for the Issuer.
