Discuss any trends which are likely to impact the Issuer including trends in the Issuer's market(s) or political/regulatory trends. **The economic value of the Company's exploration and evaluation assets is dependent, among other factors, on the market price of uranium and rare earth element metals ('REEs'). Uranium has been in oversupply for some time as downgraded material from the dismantling of nuclear warheads, is being used as fuel for nuclear reactor electricity generation. This source of supply has largely come to an end. More recently, the tsunami in Japan resulted in the shut-down of all of its 48 nuclear reactors. China's build program for more nuclear reactors will be increasing demand in the next few years.**

From a low of US\$28 per pound in May, the spot price has improved to US\$32.65 at the end of August

With regard to REEs, China is said to control 90% of the world supply, although exact quantities are difficult to confirm. China is currently applying quotas on the export of REEs, contrary to World Trade Organization rules and is reported to be purchasing REEs on world markets, but there has not yet been significant price increases.

The consensus in the industry is that uranium prices will continue to strengthen in the coming year, and China's production of REEs is no longer adequate to supply its own requirement of certain REEs and the developing shortage is expected to increase prices to a level required to make new mining projects economically viable.

Appia's mineral resources at Elliot Lake, Ontario have a combined uranium and REEs content, recoverable in the same flotation process and subsequent recovery treatments.
