Report on Business

The BacTech bioleaching technology can be applied to the remediation of polluted mine waste in an economically beneficial manner. The BacTech bioleaching technology has been used commercially in the past for the liberation of precious and base metals from difficult to treat mine concentrates and ores.

The business plan for BacTech Environmental Corporation is to apply the BacTech bioleaching technology to abatement projects to remove harmful elements such as arsenic and sulphur from the environment, where this can be assisted by a positive cash flow from metal recovery. Metals which could be extracted include gold, silver, cobalt, nickel, copper, uranium and zinc.

2. Provide a general overview and discussion of the activities of management.

The Company commenced Field Investigation on the site for the bioleach remediation processing plant site to be built at Snow Lake, Manitoba. The Field Investigation includes the drilling of deep test holes with a continuous flight auger drill rig. Samples will be collected at regular intervals during the drilling program for analysis, and the installation of Piezometers to monitor the groundwater table. The investigation results will provide detailed site conditions to begin the Front End Engineering Design ("FEED") - civil specifications for the plant and tank farm areas.

The Company submitted the Environmental Act Proposal ("EAP") for the Snow Lake, Manitoba project to the Director of the Environmental Assessment and Licensing Branch, Manitoba Conservation and Water Stewardship. The EAP was completed by Golder Associates Ltd. of Winnipeg, Manitoba, under direction by the BacTech technical team.

In November, the Company's shares were approved for trading in the United States. BacTech received notice from its sponsoring broker, Pennaluna and Company ("Pennaluna"), that its shares will be quoted on the OTC Pink Sheets in the U.S. as of November 8. Pennaluna will be the market maker for the common shares of BacTech, which will trade under the symbol "BCCEF". Pennaluna & Company of Coeur d'Alene, Idaho (www.pennaluna.com), submitted the required filings in October.

Company representatives attended the Edelmetall & Rohstoffmesse show in Munich, Germany, and the Manitoba Mining and Minerals Convention in Winnipeg, Manitoba. At the request of the Bulgarian government, Ross Orr, President & CEO, visited Bulgaria to discuss the use of bioleaching on tailings sites in that country. He also met with institutions in London to discuss future financing plans for the Snow Lake plant. A trip is planned for early January to visit COMIBOL, the Bolivian state mining company, to discuss the results of the assaying of material from the Telamayú tailings in Bolivia.

The Company continues to receive and evaluate other expressions of interest and potential projects from many different countries and companies.
