Report on Business

America Potash LLC ("American Potash"), a wholly-owned subsidiary of the Issuer, received an independent Qualified Person ("QP") review and National Instrument ("NI") 43-101 compliant Technical Report prepared by Agapito Associates Inc. of Grand Junction, Colorado ("Agapito Report") regarding the Company's extensive 20,620 hectares Green River Potash Project (the "Property") located within the geologically favorable Paradox Basin near the town of Moab in Grand County, Utah.

Key Highlights of the Agapito Report include:

- 600 million – 1 billion tonnes of potash are permissive in the horizon known as Cycle 5, the main exploration target, and is known to host potash at a nearby producing mine;
- The Cycle 5 potash bearing horizon has the potential to grade up to 19-29% KCl (potassium chloride) as indicated by down hole gamma ray surveys; and
- The Cycle 5 sedimentary horizon is extensive and very continuous at depth throughout the Company's large 20,620 hectare property.

On May 4, 2012, the US Department of the Interior, Bureau of Land Management, posted a notice on the Federal Registry regarding the establishment of the Ten Mile Known Potash Leasing Area ("KPLA"). This action establishes that the lands within the Ten Mile KPLA may no longer be available for non-competitive leasing for potash and may instead be available through a competitive leasing process. The newly established Ten Mile KPLA boundary overlies a portion of the Company's prospecting permit applications (non-competitive lease applications) and as a result has reduced the Property by 8,738 ha from 29,358 ha to 20,620 ha.

Management continued to prepare exploration plans and budgets for American Potash Utah State potash and lithium leases. Management is active in engaging consultants to assist in the evaluation of the potash property and to help in clarifying and developing appropriate exploration plans.

The state of the economy and capital markets may impact on the Issuer's ability to raise the funds necessary for exploration on the potash prospects held under lease or option or exploration permit application or to exercise the option.

The potash market has certain significant structural and market challenges for new entrants. Good deposits that are economical to mine are rare and barriers to entering the industry are high. Significant upfront and continuing capital investment and at least seven years are required to bring a new mine to production. However, government involvement in and ownership of the industry are low. If the Issuer exercises the option and acquires the permits there is no assurance that the properties will contain an economically viable deposit or, if the properties do contain an economically viable deposit, that the Issuer will be able to raise sufficient capital to mine the deposit.

The viability and profitability of developing the properties will also depend on, among other factors, continued global demand and a favourable price for potash. Rising prices have encouraged potash producers to increase production through expansion and development projects. If supply increases faster than world consumption, prices could be depressed for a prolonged period. Fluctuations in demand are characteristic of this market and there is no assurance that global demand will continue to increase or that potash prices will continue to be favourable.
