The Issuer is in the development stage and currently holds two contiguous mineral properties located in the Similkameen Mining Division, British Columbia, Canada. The Issuer is in the process of determining whether these properties contain reserves that are economically recoverable.

Pursuant to a Mining Venture Agreement dated March 31st, 2005, as amended by Extension Agreement dated October 31st, 2005 (collectively the "Mining Venture Agreement"), with International Tower Hill Mines Ltd. ("ITH"), the Issuer was granted the right to acquire a



50% interest in two claim groups, the Siwash 4 Mineral Claim, consisting of 16 units, and the Siwash 3 Mineral Claim, consisting of 16 units, located in southeastern British Columbia at Siwash Creek, in the Similkameen Mining Division (the "Siwash Mineral Claims".

Pursuant to a letter agreement with ITH dated September 22, 2006 (the "Letter Agreement"), the parties agreed to terminate the Mining Venture Agreement, to be replaced by the Mineral Acquisition Agreement. Under the Mineral Property Acquisition Agreement, ITH agreed to sell to the Issuer all of its right, title and interest in and to the Siwash Mineral Claims, as well as additional claims in the Siwash Creek area (collectively the "Siwash Property"), free and clear of all liens, charges, encumbrances, claims or rights of others. The Siwash Property is comprised of 97 mineral claims, including the Siwash Mineral Claims.

On July 22, 2010, the Issuer entered into a Mining Venture Agreement with River Wild Exploration Inc. whereby the Issuer can earn a 50% working interest in 25 mineral claims located in southeastern British Columbia at Siwash Creek in the Similkameen Mining, which claims are contiguous to the Siwash Property (the "River Wild Claims").

In order to earn a 50% interest in the River Wild Claims the Issuer must pay the sum of \$50,000, which has been paid, and expend a minimum of \$100,000 on a work program on the property, which was to have been completed on or before March 31, 2011. The Issuer has now completed Phase 1a of the recommended work program. The River Wild Claims are contiguous to the Siwash Creek Property so the \$100,000 work program was carried out on both properties simultaneously.

Subject to positive results from Phase 1, and at the Company's sole discretion, it shall carry out Phase 2 of a recommended work program at a cost of \$300,000.

During the term of the agreement the Issuer must ensure that the River Wild Claims are maintained in good standing. The River Wild Claims are subject to a 2.5% net smelter returns royalty.

Due to global demand, prices of metals have appreciated significantly during the last few years. Barring any unforeseen events, it is generally expected that the worldwide demand for metals will continue for the foreseeable future. Should this trend continue, it is expected that minerals prospects of merit will be more difficult and expensive to acquire, and furthermore, it will be more difficult and expensive for mineral exploration companies to acquire and utilize the services of professional individuals and companies who provide their services to the mineral exploration sector. Moreover, changing conditions in the financial markets may have a direct impact on the Issuer's ability to raise capital.

In addition, resource exploration and development is a speculative business, characterized by a number of significant risks and trends including, among other things:

- 1. Mineral exploration and development involves a high degree of risk which even a combination of experience, knowledge and careful evaluation may not be able to mitigate. There is no assurance that the Issuer's mineral exploration and development activities will result in any discoveries of commercial bodies of ore. The long-term profitability of the Issuer's operations will be in part directly related to the cost and success of its exploration programs, which may be affected by a number of factors.
- 2. Governmental regulations, including those regulations governing the protection of the environment, taxes, labour standards, occupational health, waste disposal, mine safety and other matters, could have an adverse impact on the Issuer and,
- 3. While the Issuer has reviewed and is satisfied with the title to the claims comprising the Property, and, to the best of its knowledge, such title is in good standing, there is no guarantee that titles to such claims will not be challenged or impugned. The Issuer's properties may be subject to prior unregistered agreements of transfer or aboriginal land claims, and title may be affected by undetected defects.
- 4. In absence of cash flows from operations the Issuer relies on capital markets to funds its exploration in order to achieve its exploration targets.
