

**EASYMED TECHNOLOGIES INC. (Formerly EASYMED SERVICES INC.)
MANAGEMENT'S DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS
OF THE COMPANY'S FINANCIAL CONDITION AND RESULTS OF OPERATIONS
THREE MONTHS ENDED JANUARY 31, 2015.**

Date and Subject of Report

The following Management Discussion & Analysis ("MD&A") is intended to assist in the understanding of the trends and significant changes in the financial condition and results of operations of EasyMed Technologies Inc. (formerly EasyMed Services Inc.) ("EasyMed" or the "Company") for three months ended January 31, 2015 and should be read with the Company's condensed consolidated interim financial statements for the same period and the annual consolidation financial statements for the most recent year ended October 31, 2014. The MD&A has been prepared effective March 30, 2015.

Financial statements of the Company are reported in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards ("IFRS"). Both the financial statements and MD&A of the Company are presented in Swiss Francs unless stated otherwise.

Overall Performance

The company conducted its main business, through its Swiss wholly owned Swiss subsidiary, EasyMed Services S.A., to design, develop, and deliver end-to-end patient care solutions through mobile phone/PDA and server technologies offering specialized services and applications for healthcare, insurance and pharmaceutical industries. In January 2015, the Company decided to end the operations of EasymMed Services S.A. in order to preserve resources and has disposed this subsidiary on March 5, 2015. The Company is actively looking for new business opportunities.

Private placement

The Company closed a non-brokered private placement for the issuance of 35,000,000 units at CA\$0.02 per unit for gross proceeds of CA\$700,000 (CHF509,810) on January 30, 2015. Each unit consists of one common share and one share purchase warrant of the Company. Each warrant can be converted into one common share at CA\$0.05 (CHF0.04) per share for a period of five years after issuance. The Company will use the gross proceeds for its working capital.

Debt settlement

During 2015 Q1, various debtors assigned their debt to Hiram Consultants S.A. ("Hiram"), a company associated to Mr. Ayub Khan who holds directly or indirectly more than 10% of the Company's outstanding shares. In total, loans of CHF487,958 and accrued interest of CHF58,310, accounts payable of CHF47,261 and accounts payable to the CFO of the Company of CHF70,645 (collectively the "Debt") were assigned to

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Hiram. On January 30, 2015, the Company paid Hiram CA\$620,087 (CHF451,609) in full settlement of the Debt.

Outlook

Subsequently to the three months ended January 31, 2015, the Company has appointed two new directors. Mr. Ljubo Mikulic, a businessman with over 30 years of international public market experience, has been appointed the CEO and director of the Company. Mr. Peter G. Wilson, an experienced management executive with involvement in the finance industry for the past 18 years acting as senior management and lead financier of multiple private and public entities has been appointed as the director of the Company as well.

The Company entered into a memorandum of understanding with Infinia IT GmbH ("Infinia"), a private Swiss company develops innovative technologies in the renewable energy sector on March 18, 2015. The Company has paid CA\$100,000 deposit for the exclusive world distribution rights for all of Infinia's technology and an option to purchase 50% of Infinia. The definitive agreement between Infinia and the Company is still being finalized.

The Company's losses in the past, as well as in the near future, are not subject to seasonality. The fluctuation within the past eight quarters was mainly driven by incidental events such as:

- a) The Company has recorded net earnings in 2013 Q3 - an improvement comparing to other quarters which show quarterly losses. This improvement is a result of recording a non-recurring gain of CHF 99,449 from interest payable forgiveness in connection with related party loans in 2013 Q3.

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- b) The Company has recorded net earnings in 2015 Q1 - an improvement comparing to other quarters which show quarterly losses. This improvement is a result of recording a non-recurring gain of CHF 212,565 from debt settlement at discount.

Three months ended January 31, 2015 (the "2015 Q1")

Net income in 205 Q1 was CHF 200,250 comparing to a loss of CHF 82,032 in 2014Q1, an improvement of CHF 282,282. The net income in 2015 Q1 was mainly a result of CHF 5,100 revenue and other revenue (2014 Q1 – CHF 5,1931), gain on debt settlement of CHF212,565 (2014 Q1 –CHF Nil) which were offset by incurring operating expenses of CHF 12,315 (2014 Q1 – CHF87,225).

As discussed in the above, the Company settled all the outstanding loan plus unpaid interest and some accounts payable during 2015 Q1 at discount. A gain on the settlement of CHF 212,565 was recognized to the statement of comprehensive income. There was no similar transaction in 2014 Q1.

Operating expenses decreased by CHF 74,910 in 2015 Q1 as the Company has been terminating its operations in the Swiss. Main components of the operating expenses are salaries and consultant fees of CHF 3,034 (2014 Q1 – CHF 31,168), general operating expenses of CHF 14,381 (2014 Q1 – CHF56,057). Salaries and consultants decreased as various staff members of the Company left the Company in Fiscal 2014. General operating expenses decreased as the Company has been terminating its operations in Swiss during 2015 Q1.

As at January 31, 2015, the Company had CHF 65,946 cash (October 31, 2014 – CHF7,575), CHF61,056 accounts payable and accrued liabilities (October 31, 2014 – CHF249,142), CHF Nil loans payable to related party (October 31, 2014 – CHF465,491), CHF Nil loan payable (October 31, 2014 – CHF22,467) and share capital of CHF 2,181,530 (October 31, 2014 – CHF1,671,720).

The increase of cash is mainly a combined result of receiving CHF 509,810 from a private placement which was partially offset by payments of 451,609 used to settle all outstanding loans, loans from related parties, and various accounts payable in discount, which are discussed in the above.

Liquidity and Capital Resources

As at January 31, 2015, the Company had cash of CHF 65,946 (2014/10/31 – CHF 7,575) and working capital deficiency of CHF 9,460 (2014/10/31 – deficiency of CHF 743,875). The Company may consider additional debt/equity financing in order to eliminate the working capital deficiency.

Net cash provided by (used) in operating activities during 2015 Q1 was CHF 170 (2014 Q1 – CHF (113,998)). Net cash provided by financing activities during 2015 Q1 was CHF 58,201 (2014 Q1– CHF 83,086), which was a result of a net increase in share issuance and loan/related party loan.

Management realized that the current resources on hand are not adequate to meet the operational needs in the next twelve operating periods and to meet its long term business goals. In addition the Company is required to raise money to eliminate its working capital deficiency and to provide resources to fulfill the Company's obligations when they are due. The Company plans to conduct further non-current debt financing and/or equity financing in the future in order to provide the Company a positive working capital and adequate

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liquidity to finance its operations. Readers are cautioned that the Company may not be able to do so in the future even the Company has a history to raise capital in the past when needed.

Included in the Company's accounts payable and accrued liabilities as at January 31, 2015 was CHF Nil (October 31, 2014 - CHF81,868) owing to the Company's Chief Financial Officer. The amount is due on demand, is unsecured and is non-interest bearing.

Loans payable to related parties

As at January 31, 2015, the Company's loans payable to related parties was CHF Nil (October 31, 2014 – CHF465,491) after the settlement made on January 31, 2015 which is discussed in the previous section.

Share Data

As at the date of this MD&A, the Company had 47,963,287 common shares issued and outstanding. The Company has 160,000 stock options and 35,000,000 share purchase warrants outstanding that can be converted into the Company's common shares on a one-to-one basis.

Financial Instruments

Refer to Note 8 to the Company's audited consolidated financial statements for the year ended October 31, 2014 and Note 8 to the Company's condensed consolidated interim financial statements for three months ended January 31, 2015.

Off-Balance Sheet Arrangements

The Company does not have off-balance sheet arrangements.

The Company does not have proposed transactions that may have material impact to the Company except the memorandum of understanding with Infinia discussed in the previous section.
